



ANNUAL SALARY DIFFERENCE

TIMELINE






WAYS TO EARN HOURS

- Design Competitions






SET UP YOUR RECORD

Go to ncarb.org to set up an NCARB account and establish your record.


- \$100 initial registration fee

VERIFY YOUR SUPERVISOR

AXP supervisor oversees your work and confirms your hours prior to NCARB approval



- Exams can be scheduled in any order
- Can be taken online (at home) or at PSI testing centers
- Each exam costs \$210 (\$1,260 total)
- 5 year rolling clock

- Utilize online and textbook resources to study for one exam at a time
- Check with your employer to see what resources they have available to offer



SCORING



- Pass/fail system
- Scores typically processed within a week
- Must wait 60 days to retake a division
- Can only take same division 3 times in 1 year
- Score verification
 \$100
- Challenge/Review
 - \$300+



THE ROLLING CLOCK



- Once you pass first exam, you have 5 years to complete the rest
- Must retake each division that expires after 5 years rolling clock

Once you've earned a degree, gained experience, and passed the exam, you can apply for a license!

Each state or territory—called a jurisdiction—issues its own licenses, and some have additional requirements before you can become an architect.



Requirements

The applicant is required to be a resident of the jurisdiction.

An interview is required for initial registration.




The jurisdiction will accept candidates who have completed the ARE prior to graduation through participation in an IPAL program.

A fee is charged for processing exam applications.
